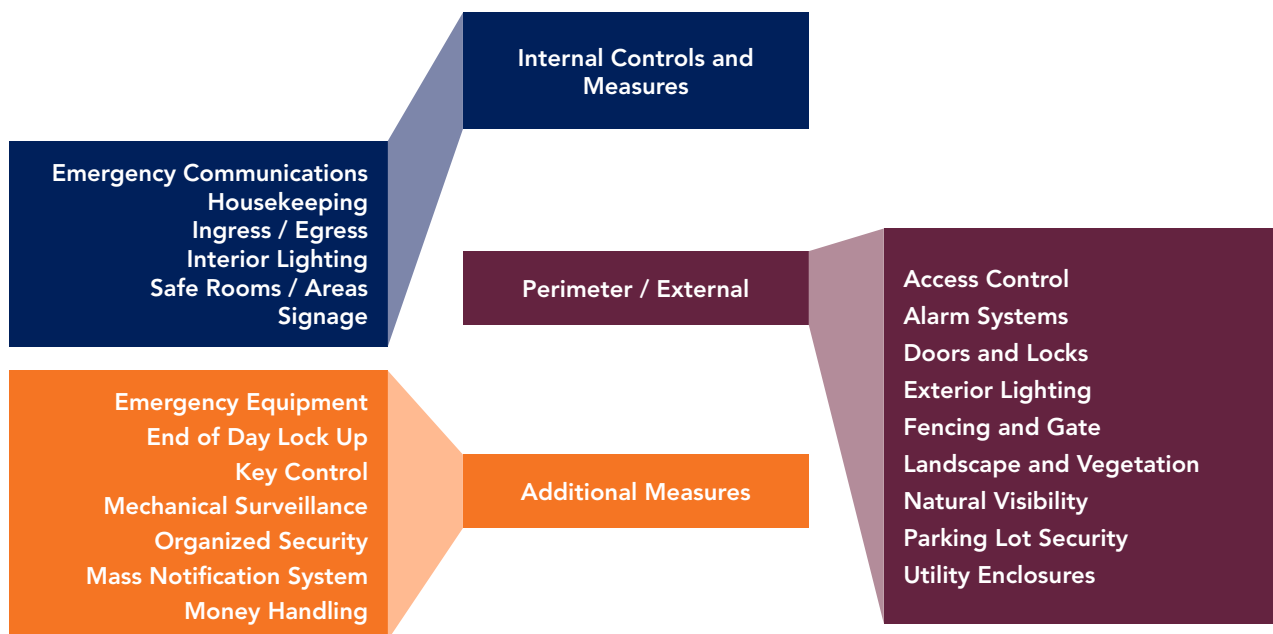

TaPS assessments are conducted in accordance with California Government Code 6254 (aa) and therefore are considered confidential information.
